When God shows up, we begin to see with renewed faith. Please remember--Jesus desires to meet with us each Sunday in the holy Eucharist in the bread and the wine!

Be encouraged as you continue your life journey. In all the ups and downs of life, Jesus has already assured us His presence is with us forever even when our lives seem complicated. Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

It can be so tempting to divide my attention, to try to do several things at once. But rather than increasing my efficiency, multitasking actually fritters away my energy and focus.


Today I give my full attention to all I choose to do. I find time expands and I move quickly through each task. My focus is sharp, and my energy builds until I feel invigorated.
